

National Resources

Government entities, nonprofits and research organizations offer an array of relevant environmental health and equity data. Many sites provide ready-made maps or charts or allow researchers access to metadata or self-serve mapping tools that allow them to pinpoint indicators tied to specific regions of interest, often down to the Census-tract level.



SOCIAL CONDITIONS



CDC/ATSDR SOCIAL VULNERABILITY INDEX (SVI)

Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR)

The SVI is a place-based index, database and mapping application to identify and quantify communities experiencing social vulnerability across four themes:

- Socioeconomic Status,
- ➤ Household Characteristics,
- ➤ Racial & Ethnic Minority Status
- Housing Type & Transportation.

*A previous version of this guide included the Council on Environmental Quality's Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool (CEJST) and EPA's Environmental Justice Screen (EJScreen) which are no longer available through the federal government.





NATIONAL LEAGUE OF CITIES: FEDERAL GRANT NAVIGATION EQUITY DASHBOARD

National League of Cities

Dashboard with 200+ indicators related to health, education, workforce, and housing to measure vulnerability at each Census tract and overlay this with city-level demographic data. The tool helps consolidate a wide range of indicators and datasets to provide a granular data narrative.



ASSET LIMITED, INCOME CONSTRAINED, EMPLOYED (ALICE) ECONOMIC VIABILITY DASHBOARD & REPORT

United for ALICE

Dashboard and reports with indicators and tools to demonstrate financial hardship and community conditions beyond the limited framework of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and focuses on four main elements: work, housing, community, and gaps.

Annual data for nearly every county in the U.S. with overall measures of local health across four sub-areas (Health Behaviors, Clinical Care, Social and Economic Factors, and Physical Environment) and Health Outcomes (length and quality of life).



CITY HEALTH DASHBOARD

NYU Langone Health

Data on 40+ measures of health and factors affecting health across five areas (Health Behaviors, Social and Economic Factors, Physical Environment, Health Outcomes, and Clinical Care) for 970+ cities across the U.S. (all 50,000+ population).

Sourced from the U.S. Census and National Center for Health Statistics.
