



DEPARTMENT OF TOXIC SUBSTANCES CONTROL (DTSC)

Cleanup Loans and Environmental Assistance to Neighborhoods (CLEAN) and Investigating Site Contamination Program (ISCP)

Provide low-interest loans for property owners, developers, community groups and local governments to investigate, cleanup and redevelop abandoned and underutilized urban properties.

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD (SWRCB)

Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (USTCF)

Provides a means for petroleum UST owners and operators to meet the federal and state requirements of maintaining financial responsibility to pay for any damages arising from their tank operations.

Orphan Site Cleanup Fund (OSCF)

Provides financial assistance to eligible applicants for the cleanup of sites contaminated by leaking petroleum underground storage tanks where there is no financially responsible party, and the applicant is not an eligible claimant to the UST Cleanup Fund.

Site Cleanup Subaccount Program (SCAP)

SCAP Provides grants to remediate harm or threat of harm from surface or groundwater contamination. While all contaminant types and surface water impacts are eligible, SCAP funding is expected to prioritize projects that pose significant health or environmental risks, are located in disadvantaged communities, and lack other viable funding sources.

DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Housing-Related Parks Program

Provides grants for creation of new parks or rehabilitation or improvements to existing parks.

Infill Infrastructure Grants (IIG)

Provides gap funding for infrastructure improvements for residential or mixed-use infill development projects or areas.

Affordable Housing & Sustainable Communities Program

Grants and/or loans to achieve greenhouse gas reductions, through increasing accessibility of affordable housing, employment centers, and Key Destinations via low-carbon transportation. Priorities include Disadvantaged and Low-Income Communities.



Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program

Provides annual grants to states, cities, and counties to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment.

CA STRATEGIC GROWTH COUNCIL

Transformative Climate Communities

Funds community-led development and infrastructure projects that achieve major environmental, health, and economic benefits in California's most disadvantaged communities.

CALIFORNIA NATURAL RESOURCES AGENCY (CNRA)

Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Grant Program

Funds projects that mitigate environmental impacts caused by construction, or modification, of a transportation facility. The California CNRA evaluates proposals and recommends projects for funding to the California Transportation Commission. Not available in 2026.

Urban Greening Grant

Support projects that reduce greenhouse gases by sequestering carbon, decreasing energy consumption, and reducing vehicle miles traveled. Projects also improve air and water quality.

California Fish and Wildlife's Cannabis Restoration Grant

Provides funds to clean up, remediate, and restore habitats impacted by cannabis cultivation and conduct research that benefits native species and promotes ecosystem resilience.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant Program

Encourages local and regional planning that furthers goals and best practices cited in the Regional Transportation Plan Guidelines adopted by the California Transportation Commission.

US EPA

EPA Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) Recipients in California

Entities with RLF programs provide loans and subgrants to carry out cleanup activities at brownfield sites. The application process and terms vary by entity. Currently, the City of Carson, the City of Fresno, Humboldt County, Richmond Community Foundation, and the City of Sacramento have funds.
